Dear Master Gardener,



Prepare Now for the Master Gardener Day Plant Swap on June 2, 2012

Now is a perfect time to collect seeds, transplant seedlings or dig and divide plants and gather garden related items for the plant swap.

This year's plant swap will have some simple guidelines.

1. Drop off your plants, seeds, etc. before the days activities begin for the morning. The swap area will be right outside our main meeting area.
2. Have your plants and seeds labeled with the plant name.
3. Bring a box, laundry basket, bucket or whatever you want to collect your plants in. Put your name on your collection box.
4. Plants, seeds and garden related items will be swapped on the honor system.

The most important guideline is swapping on the honor system.

If you bring items you can make your selections in the morning before the speakers start and between morning sessions. You can keep swapping items throughout the day.

Make your selections from the tables in the middle of the swap area.

Place your items in your box and place it along the side of the swap area.

If you see plants along the side of the swap area, leave them alone, they belong to someone else.

If you did not bring items for the swap you will be allowed to make selections during the last half of lunch, between and after the afternoon sessions.

By allowing the people that brought items to make selections in the morning, then opening the swap to all gardeners in the afternoon everyone will have a fair and fun opportunity.

Help make this a great event by bringing something to swap. Remember you can bring plants, seeds, and garden related items. Honor the guidelines and have fun.
