The Civil War, a gunfight on Gay Street in 1882, and a Breach of Promise lawsuit in the early 1930's are only a few stories that bring life and color to those who visit the Mabry-Hazen House, built in 1858. The Bethel Cemetery is the final resting place for over 1,600 Confederate soldiers. On site is the original caretaker's cottage built in 1886 that contains a small museum, as well as a 48 ft. tall Confederate monument erected in 1892. –

In addition to the stories that make this house come to life, you will see original artifacts including china, silver, crystal, and furniture. This will be an experience that you will never forget!!!
