Policy Challenge Results – Finals in February 2015



On Nov. 19, 2014, twelve teams competed in the first **Howard Baker Public Policy Challenge** in the Toyota Auditorium, at the Howard Baker Center for Public Policy on the UT campus. Based on the Penn Challenge, developed by the Fels Institute at the University of Pennsylvania, the HBPPC attracted around 80 students on 15 teams. Over the course of the semester, the teams lost members and/or gained members, with a final 12 teams competing in the semi-final. From these 12 teams the top five were selected, by a five-member panel of judges, to fully develop their proposals and compete in the February 2015 Finals for the top three spots and cash prizes to further their solutions. The top five teams were:
