B & W Y-12 Scholarship:

For graduating seniors from 10 counties, including Knox, studying science; for example, bio-medical engineering, environmental science, physics, chemistry, or pre-engineering at Roane State Community College, Pellissippi State Community College, Walters State Community College, Maryville College, Tennessee Technological University or the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. **Note: this scholarship is not intended for those seeking to be health care professionals.**

Scholarship Amount: \$1,400 one-time award for 1 year

Harold W. Canfield Memorial Scholarship

For graduating seniors from 10 counties, including Knox, pursuing an undergraduate degree from an accredited not-for-profit college or university. Participation in the Youth Athletic Program of the Knoxville Track Club required.

Scholarship Amount: \$1,000 one-time award for 1 year

Cherish the Child Scholarship **NEW SCHOLARSHIP!!****

For current or former students **age 25 or younger** who were served by *Smoky Mountain Children's Home* as residents or as foster care participants.

Scholarship Amount: \$3,600 one-time award for 1 year

Gordon W. and Agnes P. Cobb Scholarship

For graduating seniors of high schools located in Blount, Loudon, or Knox County, or current college/university students who graduated from a high school located in Blount, Loudon or Knox County, pursuing a 4-year undergraduate degree in health care and/or a medical-related field.

Scholarship Amount: \$10,000 per year award for up to 4 years

James K. Goldston INFOSEC Scholarship *2016 EXPANDED CRITERIA!!!****

Graduating high school seniors, college/university students **AND adult students** from ETF 25-county service area pursuing **undergraduate programs of study in computer science, computer engineering, cyber science, information security, OR a National Security Agency-approved Information Security (INFOSEC) curriculum.** Open to former recipients.

Scholarship Amount: \$1,200 one-time award for 1 year

Michael David Greene Scholarship *EXPANDED TO TWO-YEAR SCHOLARSHIP!!

For Farragut High School (FHS) graduate who participated in the FHS band program

Scholarship Amount: \$1,000 per year for two years

Knox Central Class of '50 Alumni Association Scholarship

For graduating senior of Central High School.

Scholarship Amount: \$2,250 one-time award for 1 year

Knox Central Class of '50 Alumni Association-Strader Scholarship

For graduating seniors of Central High School.

Scholarship Amount: \$3,500 per year for up to four years

Knoxville Business Association Scholarship: *2016 EXPANDED CRITERIA!!!

For graduating seniors from public or private high schools located in Knox County planning to pursue a business-related degree from the University of Tennessee. **NOTE: Major does NOT have to be within the school of business.**

Scholarship Amount: \$1,000 first year; \$1,500 second year; \$2,000 third year; \$2,500 fourth year

Brandy Maples Memorial Scholarship

For graduating seniors of Carter High School.

Scholarship Amount: \$1,000 per year award for up to two years

Hugh B. Martin Memorial Scholarship

For graduating seniors and current students who attend Smithwood Baptist Church in Knoxville.

Scholarship Amount: \$1,000 per year for 1 year

Lawrence Strader Boy Scouts of America Scholarship

For graduating seniors from 21 counties, including Knox, who are currently registered members of Boy Scouts of America, Great Smoky Mountain Council, with a minimum of three years participation as a Boy Scout.

Scholarship Amount: \$3,000 per year award for up to 4 years

Debbie Van Cleave Scholarship:

The scholarship is intended to benefit legally blind students from ETF's 25-county service area to pursue higher education. Applicants must be blind with vision of 20/200 or less in the better eye **after** correction and/or a visual field reduced to 20 degrees or less. Graduating high school seniors, current college/university students, GED recipients, and returning adult students may apply.

Scholarship Amount: \$1,000 one-time award for one year
