General GBP Requirements

- a) You need 9 points per SEMESTER to remain in good standing.
- b) Gamma Beta Phi events
 - i) You will sign in when you arrive and you must sign out before you leave in order to receive full participation points per an hour or event.
- c) Monthly meetings are every three weeks and a point will be awarded for attending.
- d) Being on a committee is no longer a point. You are required to be on a committee to be in good social standing with Gamma Beta Phi.
- e) Being a leader on a committee is no longer a point.

o The Food and Social Committee works together to plan, coordinate and implement GBP chapter events.
