



Doctoral Fellowship in Coastal and Water Research at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette

The Institute for Coastal and Water Research (ICaWR) at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette will be awarding one Doctoral Fellowship for a PhD student starting Fall 2016. This prestigious Fellowship will be awarded to a highly qualified applicant with interest in conducting their doctoral research on coastal or water resource issues. The Fellowship is funded for 4 years with a competitive stipend and tuition waiver, and is contingent on being accepted into the Doctoral Graduate program in either the Department of Biology or College of Engineering, in addition to admittance by the University's Graduate School.
