Resources in the Warnell School of Forestry and Natural Resources at the University of Georgia. The overall project will evaluate the implications of midrotation pine plantation treatments for wildlife habitat and stand profitability. Specifically, the successful applicant will address the following objectives: (1) evaluate the effects of four mid-rotation timber harvest regimes, with and without prescribed fire, on northern bobwhite habitat, wild turkey habitat, and white-tailed deer forage quantity; (2) evaluate the effects of the four mid-rotation timber harvest regimes on stand net present value (NPV); and (3) identify the treatment combination resulting in optimization of financial returns and wildlife habitat quality. The student's thesis or dissertation may include part

or all of those components as their interests and project goals allow.

The successful student will be co-advised by Dr. Karl Miller (http://www.ugadeerresearch.org/) and Dr. James A. Martin. The student will have ample opportunities to work with the timber industry, state wildlife agency, and private landowners.
