



The city of Duisburg is at the heart of the Ruhr industrial area and at the intersections of the **Rhine** and **Ruhr** rivers. Duisburg is a central site of the industrial heritage route in Western Germany.

A highlight is the **Thyssen** factory in the North of Duisburg, transformed into a landscape park and cultural center. The summer school also draws on the cultural diversity of the region, with a migrant population in North-Rhine-Westphalia of 10.5% and city quarters with large ethnic populations and businesses.

Excursions are planned as part of the program in order to introduce international students to the industrial and multicultural history of the city and region.

The Summer School is part of a new BA initiative in Global and Transnational Sociology at the University of Duisburg-Essen and is supported by the strong research activities of the faculty in comparative, international and transnational sociology.
