Eligible Projects: Projects must advance the conservation of landscapes that are critical for the conservation of freshwater turtles in North America OR otherwise support long-term, field-based research or conservation. Focal landscapes, widespread SGCN, and range restricted taxa (listed below) will be prioritized, especially those species for which there are limited alternative funding sources.
