Desirable is a focus on plant ecology and biogeochemistry and expertise in mire or wetlands ecology. The preparation of a PhD-theses within the project is expected (the PhD thesis should be submitted in English as a collection of peer-reviewed papers, i.e. a "cumulative thesis").
