This long-term ethnographic work is the subject of her upcoming book, Digging Deeper: Why Fairtrade won't realize sustainability for agricultural communities in the era of climate change examines the ways climate change compounds ongoing socio-ecological issues of natural resources management, natural hazards, environmental health, food security, and inequality for agricultural communities.
