

## ***The Tennessean (1812-2002)***


TEL access to *The Tennessean* (1812 -2002) begins on October 1<sup>st</sup>. Combined with TEL's access to the current *Tennessean*, Tennesseans will now be able to search the from 1812 to today. This guide should assist in helping to set up your library's access to the new resource.

### ***The Tennessean (1812-2002)***

Full text digital archive of The Nashville Tennessean newspaper, 1812-2002. Nashville's main daily newspaper; it has undergone numerous mergers and acquisitions throughout the 19th century, emerging as the *Nashville Tennessean* in 1907.

### **Why your patrons will love *The Nashville Tennessean*:**

- **Full access to the historical newspaper:** Users can study the progression of issues over time by browsing entire issues, including news articles, photos, advertisements, classified ads, obituaries and cartoons from 1812-2002.
- **Insight into multiple perspectives:** On the intuitive ProQuest platform, users can find a broader view of issues and events by cross-searching all the complete runs of the Tennessean.
- **User-friendly support tools to facilitate research:** issues are searchable by keyword, date ranges, specific dates, author and more. Users can find relevant material quickly with hit-term highlighting and download PDFs of articles or images.

## Accessing *The Tennessean*

If you already have a link to *The Tennessean*, you are all set. After October 1, when you click on the link to the *Tennessean*, you will now see *The Tennessean* (2003-Current) and *Nashville Tennessean* (1812-2002).

### Options for setting up access to the *Tennessean*

#### A. Create Direct URL for *Tennessean* (only needed if you don't need

1. Go to <https://tntel.info/resource/tel-link-generator-library-staff>
2. Click on ProQuest tab

Use this link generator to create customized TEL database URLs for your library. These URLs are unique to your library, allow you to collect usage statistics for your institution, and include geolocation authentication so your patrons can access TEL resources without entering a username or password. For each TEL vendor, enter your library's account information (e.g., Location ID for Gale; Token for Learning Express) and click Go. Simply copy and paste the URLs when building your library's web site. If you don't know your institution's account information, please contact the vendors directly for that information.

3. If you know your ProQuest token, enter that and click Go
4. If you don't know your ProQuest Token, email [customer\\_service@proquest.com](mailto:customer_service@proquest.com) for your token for the *Tennessean* for Tennessee Electronic Library. Request admin account to access usage reports at the same time.
5. Once you receive your Token, you can enter it into the TEL Link Generator to create a unique URL for your library. You will now be able to access the *Nashville Tennessean* (1812-2002) and *Tennessean* (2003-2012) through the same URL.
