## **Visual Communication for Non-Designers**

This course will give students outside the art and design fields a working knowledge of basic graphic design principles along with technical skills and theoretical explanations to promote and improve visual literacy and their ability to communicate visually. The primary focus of this course will be to gain a proficiency in digital applications used by designers such as Adobe Illustrator, InDesign, and Photoshop. Using these tools, students will learn to create visually striking posters, infographics, documents, and presentations.

Course requirements: This course is open to all students at sophomore level or above. No prerequisite training or courses are required for this course, but students must have a laptop computer present at every class (no exceptions) as well as access to the most recent version of the Adobe Creative Cloud applications used in the course.

### **Contemporary Landscapes: Problems and Potentials**

The course will also provide a global survey of the people and projects that are engaging in these landscape changes. These projects will range across scales from site to system and provide students with a greater understanding of the potentials for engaging these landscape issues through design and related fields.
