This includes dormitories and fraternity or sorority houses.

Your college or university will arrange for you to respond.

Check with the housing office or a resident assistant to learn how.

Off Campus

This includes apartments and houses.

Invites will come by March 12-20.

One person in your household should respond online, by phone or by mail with information about everyone living there.

2020 Census FAQ

1. English isn't my first language.

The online Census form comes in 13 languages. At 2020census.gov, language guides are available for 59 non-English languages.



2. Is my privacy protected?



Information collected by the Census Bureau is confidential. Under Federal Law, it can't be shared with government agencies. Only statistics data can be released.

3. Does my response matter?

This community gets \$145 for every person who responds.



"One Person, One Vote" — From Congressional districts to School Board, all levels of government use Census data to ensure equal representation.
